# **Defining Storytelling**

We define storytelling as a firstperson narrative about a specific incident that compels people to take action.

• First-person narrative: This is something that happened to you. Not a friend, not a family member, not something you heard about. If we do not tell a first-person narrative, we risk telling other people's stories, and what originally intended as self-expression and self-advocacy becomes speaking for someone else.

- Specific incident: In storytelling, we want to talk about a specific thing that happened to you. Usually this is something relatively time-bound (happened over the course of a day, a week, etc.), and you can identify when the incident started and ended. Examples of a non-specific incident include more ambiguous timelines like "throughout my childhood." Specificity lends itself to details that make the listener able to enter the world of the story.
- Compels people to take specific action: Within the context of organizing, stories must always compel people to take action, and that actions should be as specific as
